

Woking 2027 DPD Consultation : GB10, GB11 & GB14

Dear Sir or Madam,

We are writing to register our objections to the removal of areas GB10, 11 & 14 from the green belt and to proposals to build houses on parcels GB10/11 after 2027.

The main reasons are as follows :

1. Urban sprawl will be increased
2. No exceptional circumstances demonstrated for 1200 houses
3. No proximity to a local centre
4. Transport infrastructure will be overloaded
5. The density of housing is not compatible with the surroundings

We would like to comment on the particular issues with area GB14 which is

The land adjacent to Hook Hill Lane, Hook Heath GU22 OPS :

Hook Hill Lane is very narrow with a weak bridge (max gvw 3.5 t). This lane is used as a cut through from Hook Heath Rd to the A320 at the

Egley Rd roundabout. The lane is not wide enough for vehicles travelling

In opposite directions to pass without one car stopping. There is no pavement,

Nor is there any scope for adding a pavement. This lane is especially dangerous

For pedestrians at peak times, namely mornings and early evenings.

The new proposals inevitably will produce a huge increase in traffic which

Would surely be catastrophic for road safety.

In conclusion we feel it important to maintain the open spaces between the

Individual villages and communities on the outskirts of Woking.
