Dear Jeni Jackson,

I am writing to object to the proposed destruction of part of Pyrford's greenbelt, and the building of 400+ new houses on either side of Upshot Lane.

I'm fundamentally opposed to the loss of any greenbelt. It's there to protect our countryside and needs to remain intact.

My family and I frequently walk past the edge of one of the targeted fields on a walk between it and the woods adjacent, and enjoy its beauty, peace and wildlife.

To turn the two fields over to a massive amount of new houses will destroy the current feel of our village - in fact it will lose the nature of a village.

We'll lose huge amounts of green areas, the number of houses proposed is horrific and the impact on roads and schools is untenable. Coldharbour road is already virtually impassable many mornings and the impact of potentially another 800 cars does not bear thinking about. Where the children would go to school is not clear either; to turn the village school into a mega primary with intakes of 4 or more classes will destroy its current character and potentially its quality.

In essence Pyrford would be Pyrford no more, and the tranquility and loveliness that make our area what it is will be permanently lost.

My husband and I firmly object to these proposals - because of the loss of greenbelt and because of the vast scale of new housing being proposed.
