Dear Sirs,

As a long standing Pyrford resident I object to the proposals to develop two green belt fields adjoining Upshot Lane in Pyrford. My objections are mainly centred on the following:

- Pyrford is already heavily overloaded with both local and through traffic who use our roads (including roads on the Lovelace Estate which were not built to cope with the volumes of traffic currently experienced) as a cut through when Old Woking Road (during peak times of day) and other major roads have problems. When the M25 and A3 in either direction are slow or jammed at any time of day, then Pyrford suffers.
- Parking for Pyrford School and Rosemount Parade shops is already totally inadequate. So, how will it be with another 400 families, or should I say at least another 800 cars trying to park?
- Medical & Doctor facilities at West Byfleet Medical Centre (the nearest to Pyrford) are already overloaded. Can they take on another 400 families. It already takes 3 to 4 weeks to get a doctor's appointment with the Parishes Bridge Practice!
- Surely there are more than enough designated 'Brown Sites' within the borough that could be developed so why does the 'Green Belt' need to be eroded?

I would welcome your comments on the above, especially on how Woking Council are going to overcome my objections.
