Subject: Objection to the proposed 400+ houses for Pyrford

Dear Ms Jackson

I am writing to you to object to the 400 + houses proposed for the two fields either side of Upshot Lane. I have lived in Pyrford for 30 years firstly in Lincoln Drive and for the past 27 years in Wexfenne Gardens. I was firstly attracted to Pyrford for its open spaces and greenery surrounding the area.

After bringing up 4 children who all went to Pyrford Primary school, which was and still is, a much sort after school for children to attend. How would the schooling in the area cope, I have not read that there will be anymore schools provided in the Pyrford area (only on the proposed Broadoaks, West Byfleet development) and if there are 400 houses to be built there are bound to be many more pre-school and infant school children and what about the senior schools? Would there be more doctors provided for the West Byfleet Health Centre which seems fully stretched to its capacity and trying to get an appointment to see a doctor is always a lengthy process. Will there be an additional health centre in Pyrford?

The Pyrford Road has always been heavily congested with traffic and although over the years suggestions have been made as to how to slow down the traffic nothing has been done apart from a 30 mile an hour sign which is duly ignored. The traffic has increased more and more over the years as drivers use the Pyrford Road/Lock Lane as a quick way to gain access to the A3/M25 . The traffic in West Byfleet seems to be permanently at a stand still whatever time of the day we travel but particularly during the rush hour. We have all been encouraged to cycle but this is extremely dangerous as our roads are just not wide enough to accommodate cyclists and car users safely. Again with these additional houses and cars how will our infrastructure cope?
