We would like to express our concern at the planned release of Green Belt land for development in Byfleet. Our main concerns being:-

The sheer congestion on local roads. Parvis road is virtually unusable between 7.30 to 9.30 in the morning and 3.30 to 6.30 in the evening, and anything from a small flood on the road or a broken down car can cause serious holdups. It cannot cope with any more traffic.

The village is already so congested with parking that it has now become a single lane road. There is no adequate space for current drivers to park their cars. This could affect local businesses as people give up trying to park and go elsewhere.

Byfleet is in a flood area and flood defenses are vital. Our concern is that development on this scale may add to this problem and adequate flood defenses may be overlooked.

Since we have lived in this area the Brooklands area has been developed and quite a few green spaces have been built on. Have we now got to build on Green Belt land? It would destroy Byfleet's village character and we would become a concrete jungle.

Finally would there be extra provision for schools doctors etc.
