Subject: Ojection to plan to meet housing requirements in the future

I would like to object to the plans to build on current Green Belt land in Pyrford, which have been included in the Council's plan for meeting housing requirements up to 2040. The areas I refer to are known as Lovelace Drive area and Aviary Road area. My objections are based on the following facts:

1. The area is currently designated as Green Belt, and I firmly believe we should keep this as Green Belt for future generations to enjoy, and not gradually erode the Green Belt space.
2. The roads in the area were not designed to take the amount of traffic which is currently on them. The affect of building another 423 houses in close proximity will increase the traffic substantially, and there is no evidence that the council is willing to improve the roads in the area, or has the finance to do so.
3. There needs to be firm evidence that the schools in the local area can take the extra pupils that extra housing will bring, and if they cannot cope, there needs to plans (and finance) to provide what is required.
4. The local doctors surgery is already over subscribed. There is a wait of at least 3 weeks to get a routine appointment. This may not fall directly into the Council's area, but the services required and used by residents must be able to cope with any increase in population which is brought about by the building of new homes.

5. Finally I come back to the Green Belt issue. Why were these two fields designated as Green Belt in the first place. Surely the arguments presented then should still stand. We are only custodians of where we live for a short while. Future generations will not forgive us for what we do now.

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
