Dear Sir,

I write to register my objections and concerns at the proposals to remove sites GB12 and GB13 in Pyrford from the protection of the Green Belt.

These two sites have consistently been assessed in the Green Belt Review as unsuitable as they have poor sustainability and a high landscape sensitivity. Their removal from the green belt and possible development in the future would alter the rural aspect of Pyrford village. These fields give an uninterrupted stretch of open land between the town and the river and feature strongly in Pyrford's history.

Traffic issues would result from any development as the present road - (Upshot Lane) would not be capable of taking the additional cars that would arise from the building of up to 400 new homes on either side of the road.

The current schools are full and to increase the number of homes when the current infrastructure is already oversubscribed would lead to local children being forced to attend schools outside their local area. This would generate yet more traffic.

The current health service is also at maximum, both in the provision of local doctors and transport to and treatment at local hospitals.

In all the development of these homes on green belt land is ill thought out and cannot be justified.
