Subject: Proposed houses in Pyrford - Upshot Lane

Dear Jeni

I am writing to you regarding the proposed houses in Pyrford, in the Upshot Lane area.

We moved to Pyrford 22 years ago from London, one of the main reasons being that the area is green and has a local community. We do not agree with any plans that include erosion of the green belt as it is one of the advantages of living here.

Our main objection is on the grounds of the local infrastructure. Pyrford is a small village and does not have the capacity to handle another 400 houses. The local school in Pyrford would not be able to take additional children, there is limited shopping and other facilities.

Our neighbourhood already suffers extreme traffic problems from West Byfleet to the junction of Upshot Lane and Pyrford Common Road; this is frequently made worse when there are problems on the A3 or M25. The traffic problem has worsened considerably over the last 2 years. It has taken me over half an hour to drive 2 miles from our house on several occasions since the beginning of this year. The junction of Upshot Road and Pyrford Common Road would turn into a nightmare and cause problems to anybody trying to get out of Pyrford either to Ripley or Woking.

Finally we object on environmental issues. The area is prone to flooding, the building of so many houses would undoubtedly have an impact on the geology of the area and cause problems in the surrounding vicinity.
