- 1. The Parvis Road (A245) has had at least 2 surveys carried out on it and it is virtually unusable for 6 hours a day during the commute periods. This is without the proposed new developments outlined in the proposals.
- 2. There is no infrastructure in place or proposals to help with Health Care. Current waiting time for a Doctors appointment at West Byfleet Health Centre is between 21 and 28 days
