Subject: Objection to Proposed Development

Hello Mrs. Jackson,

I am writing to you to express the deep concern of my family of the proposed earmarked development areas Pyrford Lovelace Drive Area (223 dwellings) and Aviary Road area (200 dwellings) as a resident of Lovelace Drive.

My husband grew up in Pyrford and we were both pleased to move back to Pyrford 8/9 years ago as the appeal of the peaceful setting with amazing school and still with close links to London and local amenities to hand in a small village community, where I had grown up in Weybridge where the traffic and congestion is far worse and is regularly affected by the congestion of the M25 and what used to be a peaceful town is now struggling with the strain in the schools and my parents still living there and the constraints on the NHS. We have decided to bring up our children in Pyrford and the appeal was the small caring community with many local clubs Inc. many fantastic sports clubs, as well as direct access to the countryside within a 5 minute walk and for this we are so very lucky. Our family has harmony at being able to move back here and my husband is able relive and share his memories of his childhood, especially the outstanding school which is already heavily oversubscribed. Of all the areas we could have lived around Woking we specifically chose an area where we had green space and be able to be directly in the countryside very quickly which is so important for us, and the huge appeal of the area, where our children could breathe clean air and go for walks in the countryside very easily without having to get into the car, which is very important for us.

Now I am terrified that Woking Council will make an awful mistake and regret the consequences of their decision. I am well aware of the Government requirements for providing housing and the agonizing choices you have to make with planning. The only problem with the housing proposals in Pyrford, in particular, would cause such irreparable damage to the local community which would not be able to be resolved with such a small community. Our roads are already used a cut throughs to Ripley and Woking. If you force 423 new houses into an area where single track roads are a common occurrence, residents will forced to become battery hens in their own homes, as they won't be able to use the roads.

423 new houses will mean (800+ cars) 1000's of children - Pyrford School is already at breaking point.

Plus, how would you make these homes actually affordable? If you have researched housing prices in Pyrford you will know they are already unattainable for the average family would you force greedy builders to keep their prices low? We all know that the Help to Buy option won't actually help people to buy in an area that has already considerably increased in price in the time we have lived here.

There are so many things wrong with the proposals and shame on the actual landowner who would benefit from selling this land and would inflict so much unnecessary misery on so many happy families that have supported the Conservatives through the many years.

I seriously ask you to reconsider these plans and please accept this email as our formal objection to the plans, please confirm receipt of my email.
