To whom it may concern,

I am writing you you to object to the current, and any future plans to build additional houses within Pyrford.

When we moved to Pyrford in 2002 it was because of it's charm and idilic setting. Over the last 13 years we have already noticed an increase in traffic within the village especially by the primary school at drop off and pick up times. The surrounding infrastructure is not sufficient to build more houses. All of the local roads through Pyrford are in a poor condition and additional through traffic would only make them worse.

It is only a matter of time before someone gets killed along Coldharbour Road, the speed of the cars through the village is dangerous and should be addressed before any consideration is given to more houses.

We did not move here to see the quiet tranquility demolished in favour of some 400+ houses being built. The historic nature of the village will be lost. The friendliness of the village will be lost. The village would be used as a cut through to get to the Old Woking Road.

The drain on the local services would increase further. Doctors, dentists, hospitals etc. the increased dwellings would need more shops either on the site, or there would be increased usage of the current local shops on Marshall's Parade. Although this might be nice for the shops the additional parking would also present a problem.

I feel very strongly about this matter, and if it were to be approved I can honestly say that the area would no longer be "Conservative" which would be a shame, but a Conservative borough / council would no longer represent the views of the electorate.

I hope that you will see sense, as you did last time when you tried this on, and abandon all hopes of developing the site into a 400+ rabbit hutch village.
