The proposal for this area to ensure that ground floor development to ensure vibrancy of the area and to reflect a cultural offer on the opposite side of Woking town to give a wide offer across the Centre would make this a good site for the Phoenix Cultural Centre CIC to be included in the proposal. This is already encompassing a social club and with close proximity to the railway it will allow a buffer should a venue area be included. An issue of rail sound for residents has been mentioned as something that will need to be addressed, in many towns in Britain using land next to rail as cultural and live music venues has made good use of the land as these co-exist well and being near to transport links enhances a venue's contribution to the night time economy. As more residents dwell near the station on the frontside - they will have a social area and with a hotel and large Marks and Spencer nearby plus other food outlets from different countries currently there and expanding a cultural centre and venue near the station will add to the vibrancy of that part of Town. Additionally this area on this side of town has accommodated live music venues well before i.e. Michaels and The Old Schoolhouse
