I have been a resident in Mayford for almost 10 years and am concerned about the implications of the 2027 DPD Consultation on Mayford.

Please see below my objections -

- Mayford has a poor infrastructure that would be unable to cope if a significant number of properties were to be built in the village. No doctor or dentist, only 1 small local shop, currently no school.
- as there are no current plans to improve the infrastructure of the village it would have a dramatic effect on its existing residents as the village would not cope with a large increase in additional residents
- it would mean that the village may lose its identity due to being absorbed by Woking, losing all historical connections.
- the current Green Belt would be lost leading to an irreversible change in the local environment and detrimental effect on wildlife and birds.
- major impact on local roads which are already congested. Most lanes are not lit at night and would struggle to cope with additional traffic. Access from Guildford or Woking to the above locations is over one of 3 single track bridges which would lead to further additional congestion.

I would ask the council to reconsider and look further into more suitable locations within the borough.
