Subject: Release of green belt land for development - Pyrford

I wish to register my objection to the proposed release of two fields on either side of Englif Lane for the development of 423 houses. My concerns are:

Loss of the character of Pyrford through the loss of a clear barrier between the village and the countryside

Loss of habitat - we live about 500m from the Lovelace Drive site and our garden is visited by foxes, occasionally badgers and a wide range of birds. Most winters, I have counted 30 - 35 species of birds. Recently, we have seen the return of red kites but have lost regular sightings of hedgehogs and bats due to the degradation of the habitat in recent years.

Over development of the area in the context of the existing pressure on roads, schools, medical facilities and the retail sector. We have lived here for over 30 years and have, for all that time, planned our journeys around the traffic congestion in the rush hour and, especially, the school run. These developments have the potential for 800+ cars, 800+ children needing a school place, maybe 1500 people needing a medical practice - where are these facilities or where can these be provided? It is essential to look at any proposals for Pyrford in the context of all the other proposed development sites, including Wisley and especially West Byfleet, which simply multiply these pressures on local facilities.

I sincerely hope that due consideration will be given to my objections.
