Ref sites GB14 ,GB11,GB10.

We object in the strongest possible terms to the Councils proposed developments ,in the above areas , over the forthcoming years .

It is absolutely ridiculous for the council to propose yet a further increase in the density of the existing population of Woking from it's present level . We are already bulging at the seams ! The present infrastructure cannot cope with present numbers and to increase them would be just unmanageable. The Egley Rd area is frequently at a total standstill during busy times and to increase the number of road users would cause even more chaos. Doctors and Dentists are already overflowing and cannot accept further patients and car parking is impossible in the station area already .

In 2014 the government issued councils with a guidance to protect Green Belt land ,which it would appear Woking Council intends to ignore . Only in exceptional circumstances should their recommendations be ignored and in view of the fact there are still plenty of Brown Field sites in the area , these are not exceptional times !? Further Urban sprawl is an important reason for objecting to the Councils proposals and this would be totally ignored if the land on the south side of Hook Heath was to be developed .it would result in the merging between Mayford and Hook Heath and the loss of even more green belt land. The proposed density of that proposed is six times the present level !
