To whom it may concern,

I would like to register my concern over the proposed application for 400 homes to be built on Upshot Lane in Pyrford. I spent my entire childhood and early adulthood in Pyrford and my mother still lives on Engliff Lane. This project seems ill-conceived.

This level of additional housing and concentration of people will significantly impact all the amenities, services and utilities but most immediately the local schools, GP surgeries and shops. Not to mention the noticeable impact on West Byfleet, Ripley and to some extent Woking itself.

But it also saddens me at the impact (quite possible destruction) on areas that as a child I grew up running around and enjoying playing in, which my children now enjoy - Pyrford Cricket Ground, Pyrford Common and its playground, the canal, to list a few. These will become more overcrowded and less enjoyable for all concerned. Children and adults need outdoor space to enjoy not overcrowded areas of urban greenery that are reminiscent of parts of suburban London and not the Surrey countryside.

And aside from all of the above, this does not take into account the environmental impact on the surrounding fields and waterways through a greater population density.
