Subject: 400+ New Houses for Pyrford

I have just received information on the proposed development of 423 new houses on to be built either side of Upshot Lane Pyrford. I object to this development for the following reasons:

1. The development is on Green Belt land and thus should not be used for building.
2. The roads in this area are already very congested and will not support the additional traffic that such a development will bring.
3. There is very little parking for Pyrford shops or school and more people will only make this worse.
4. Pyrford Primary School is being extended to meet present needs and will not accommodate even more children.
5. The doctors surgery in West Byfleet is already too busy and it is difficult to get an appointment, it will not cope with more people.
6. The building of 423 new homes will change the whole character of the village.

I think that a better solution for Woking Council to meet its target of building more new houses would be to create a new town with direct access to the main A roads and with its own infrastructure of doctors surgery, school, shops and all the necessary parking. A development on the site of the old Wisley airfield had been proposed as a possible site. An area such as this with direct access to the A3/M25 and accommodation built with the necessary supporting services would be a better long term solution to the housing problem that trying to add to existing towns and villages.

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
