I am writing to object to the proposal by Woking Borough Council to release Green Belt land for the development of 400+ houses in Pyrford.

I object for the following reasons

- Maintain Pyrforde's charm and character, village community and unspoilt countryside, footpaths, historic buildings and conservation areas
- Walkers come from afar to walk along the footpaths and into Ripley and beyond as it is such a beautiful scenic route - these areas of local natural beauty are becoming fewer
- Pressure on the already dangerous road system - especially along Coldharbour Road outside Pyrford Primary school and 2 nurseries
- Pressure on the infrastructure - schools, shops, doctors, elderly nursing homes
- Increase flooding risk - water and sewage impact
