Please give us your comment	The Pyrford proposals will not only add 400+ additional homes in Pyrford itself but there are further proposals for more housing at Wisley airfield, Sheer House and West Byfleet that could push the total number to 1000+ and will be a significant impact to our roads that are already congested during rush hour and school runs. Pyrford is situated between the A3, Woking town centre, M25 and West Byfleet station so any additional houses around this area will easily increase traffic volume through Pyrford to connect these points. Getting in and out of Pyrford during rush hour is already a problem and without any consideration to address traffic problems it will be an unpleasant and unviable place to live. Some of the roads connecting to the A3, eg Lock Lane and Polesden Lane, have areas with a single lane so couldn't possibly cope with the increased volume of traffic. It would destroy the peaceful and idyllic green belt setting.

The proposal would also increase the number of families

and therefore the requirement for school places. Pyrford itself can't address extra volume so where would the school places come from that won't require yet more cars on the road to take children to and from school?

We also have concerns about a large development at the top of a hill because we are fairly close to a flood plane so the water run off would cause very real issues to many Pyrford residents.

One of the reasons we moved to Pyrford was because it was surrounded by green belt, countryside and places of beauty. I feel we should be protecting it for enjoyment of future residents and visitors - not building over it and polluting the environment with additional traffic. Its not just two fields we'll lose but all the road arteries leading out and through the village and I fear it will ultimately destroy the community vibe that makes Pyrford special.

Proposed modifications - Please explain what changes you consider should be made (for example, to the text, to the site boundary)

I think Woking should be fighting against increasing housing otherwise its in danger of becoming an overrun city. There are many areas around the country that could easily build something like new towns of old and properly plan roads, schools etc. If you add housing anywhere around Woking you will eventually have gridlocked roads and I can't see how that can be addressed without bulldozing exiting houses to widen roads which seems to defeat the object.
