Dear Sir/Madam

I am writing to you with regards to the recent consultation on the green belt planning release issues. I wish to OBJECT to any release of green belt locally and indeed nationally as I firmly believe the green belt should be kept un-developed. I appreciate and understand that as a local authority you will be placed under pressure from central government to provide further housing and development however the green belt should be left alone and preserved.

Any development should be kept to brown field sites only. Any release of green belt will be most profitable to builders and property companies and ethically unprofitable for residents.

There are many reasons locally to keep all green belt intact, not least its use for common leisure activities such as walking, cycling, dog walking etc. I am a Byfleet residents and Byfleet as a village is land locked between M25 and canals so any further building would add to our already stretched public services such as Schools and Health care provision. As you are very much aware our local health care provisions are in the next village west byfleet and even now this is over subscribed so further development would be extremely detrimental to all residents. As I understand it any development on green belt should represent exceptional circumstances and as I see it just placing properties on the green belt does not represent exceptional circumstances.
